Fees for Environmental Health Services of the City of Helsinki effective as of 1.1.2026

1 § Scope of application

This fee schedule applies to

A) duties of the municipal authority laid down in the Food Act (297/2021), concerning

1. the processing of notifications on registration referred to in sections 10 and 13 and the processing of applications and notifications for approval referred to in sections 9 and 11;
2. inspections and examination of samples relating to activities referred to in section 72(1) included in the municipal supervision plan;
3. inspections carried out to monitor compliance with an order referred to in section 40(1);
4. supervision referred to in section 51(1) of an operator exporting foodstuffs outside the European Union, and the export certificate referred to in section 51(2); and
5. inspections carried out to monitor compliance with administrative coercive measures and sanctions referred to in Chapter 9 of the Food Act, based on non-compliance with food regulations.

No fees are charged for inspections carried out as part of the planned supervision of registered primary production. If a follow-up inspection is carried out in registered primary production due to a neglect, a fee is charged for the inspection. No fees referred to in items 1 and 2 are charged from food aid operators.

In addition, the municipality charges fees for other supervision and for related inspections and examinations, as provided for in Articles 7985 of Regulation (EU) No 625/2017 of the European Parliament and of the Council (hereinafter the Control Regulation).

B) duties of the municipal authority laid down in the Health Protection Act (763/1994, section 50a), concerning

6. the processing of notifications referred to in sections 13 and 18a of the Health Protection Act, the processing of an application for approval referred to in section 18, and inspections and document inspections included in the municipal supervision plan referred to in section 6, relating to the activities referred to in those sections;
7. the supervision of orders issued on the basis of notifications made pursuant to section 13 and an application made pursuant to section 18;
8. measurements, sampling, examinations and investigations relating to the activities referred to in item 6, which are connected with the investigation of health hazards or ensuring the elimination of a hazard
9. the approval of a risk assessment pursuant to section 20, and the supervision and monitoring of the quality of domestic water;
10. the supervision of bathing water quality pursuant to section 29;
11. inspections referred to in section 6(4) (ship inspections) and the issuing of certificates;
12. inspections of solarium devices referred to in section 173 of the Radiation Act.
13. domestic water examinations charged to the owner of a well where the matter does not concern a water supply area referred to in section 16(4) (subject to value-added tax).

Other services in accordance with the approved fee schedule, concerning:

14. inspections, document inspections, measurements, sampling, examinations and investigations carried out in a dwelling or other occupied premises, relating to the investigation of health hazards referred to in section 26 or ensuring their elimination, charged to the owner or holder of the property or to another party responsible for the health hazard pursuant to section 27; however, the authority's first inspection carried out to investigate a suspected health hazard in a dwelling and the related determination of the need for further investigations is free of charge.

15. measures related to the transfer of bodies referred to in the agreement on the transfer of corpses (SopS 13/1989), and supervision visits or inspections carried out in accordance with a decree issued pursuant to section 43.

16. inspections related to the supervision of compliance with provisions issued under Chapter 17 of the Environmental Protection Act.

17. inspections and document inspections, and measurements, sampling, examinations and investigations other than those referred to in items 14-15, which are related to the investigation of health hazards or ensuring the elimination of a hazard.

Where the measurements, sampling, examinations and investigations may also be carried out by an external service provider, the fee is subject to value-added tax (VAT).

C) duties of the municipal authority laid down in the Tobacco Act, concerning

18. the processing of an application for a retail sales permit referred to in section 44 of the Tobacco Act; a fee is also charged for a notification of amendment to a retail sales permit when the matter concerns the expansion of retail sales to new product categories.

19. the processing of a notification concerning the retail sale of nicotine liquids and smokeless nicotine products referred to in section 48;

20. the processing of a wholesale notification referred to in section 50;

21. the processing of an application concerning a smoking ban referred to in section 79;

22. the annual supervision fee for a sales permit and a wholesale notification referred to in section 91.

D) duties of the municipal authority laid down in the Medicines Act, concerning

23. the granting of a retail sales permit for nicotine medicinal products referred to in section 54a;

24. supervision measures referred to in section 54c.

2 § Basis for determining fees

2.1 Fees are based on the average total costs incurred by the authority for supervision, travel, inspections, sampling and examination of samples, and on the Tobacco Act.

2.2 Total costs include operating expenses arising from the performance of duties, interest and depreciation, and a share of administrative costs. The hourly rate of supervisory personnel is EUR 75,00.

2.3 Fees for external services and laboratory examinations are determined according to the costs incurred.

2.4 Fees are charged in accordance with the fee tables appended to this schedule.

2.5 Sampling under the Food Act is not subject to a separate fee, but is included in the annual basic supervision fee. The examination of food samples is subject to a fee, unless otherwise decided on grounds of reasonableness.

2.6 Sampling and examination of samples under the Health Protection Act are subject to a fee, unless otherwise decided on grounds of reasonableness.

3 § Processing and approval fees for notifications and applications

Processing fees for notifications referred to in sections 10 and 13 of the Food Act and processing fees for applications and notifications referred to in sections 9 and 11 of the Food Act, processing fees for notifications referred to in section 13 of the Health Protection Act, approval fees for establishments referred to in section 18 of the Health Protection Act, and processing fees for applications for smoking bans in housing communities referred to in section 79 of the Tobacco Act.

3.1 The general basis for determining a processing or approval fee is the extent of the processing or approval procedure. The fee is determined on the basis of the working time used to process the application or notification.

The processing of a notification referred to in sections 10 and 13 of the Food Act and a notification referred to in section 13 of the Health Protection Act includes the verification of the information contained in the notification, the transfer of data to the authority's supervision object information system, a preliminary risk assessment, and the sending of a certificate to the operator.

The working time used for the processing fee for an application or notification referred to in sections 9 and 11 of the Food Act and for the approval fee for establishments referred to in section 18 of the Health Protection Act includes an initial inspection of the premises prior to commencement of operations, inspection of documents, transfer of data to the authority's supervision object information system, a preliminary risk assessment, processing of the application, and the approval decision.

The working time used for processing an application for a smoking ban in a housing community referred to in section 79 of the Tobacco Act includes inspection of documents, processing of the application, hearing of the parties concerned, and preparation of the prohibition decision. In addition to the processing fee based on the processing time of the application, costs related to the hearing and notification of the decision, such as mailing and notification costs, are charged.

3.2 The processing or approval fee also applies to a notification or application concerning a material change in operations and to a notification concerning a change of operator. With regard to operations under the Food Act, a fee is also charged for the processing of a notification concerning the cessation of operations.

3.3 The approval fee also applies to a conditional approval decision under the Food Act. For the first conditional approval, the fee for new operations is charged, and for subsequent approvals, the fee for a material change in operations is charged in accordance with the appended fee table.

4 § Fees for inspections included in the environmental health care supervision plan

4.1 A supervision fee is charged for an inspection and sampling carried out on the basis of an approved supervision plan, and the fee is based on the time spent on the inspection. The inspection includes preparation for the inspection, average travel time, the inspection itself, and the drafting of the inspection report. The inspection may also be carried out by telephone or via a remote connection, or as a document inspection without a site visit.

The content of the inspection and the average time used for inspecting each type of supervision object are determined in the environmental health care supervision plan and quality system of the City of Helsinki. The inspection frequency of the object is determined on the basis of risk assessment. If a food premises has several different activities, the inspection frequency and the fee are determined according to the activity with the highest risk.

4.2 Where several supervisory measures included in supervision are carried out simultaneously at the same supervision object, a single combined fee is charged. If, during the same inspection visit, inspections under more than one environmental health care act are carried out at the object, the fee is charged on the basis of the principal inspection, with an additional fee of 50% of the fees for the other simultaneous inspections.

4.3 No separate fee is charged for inspections of retail and wholesale outlets for products subject to the Tobacco Act and nicotine medicinal products, or for inspections of smoking bans and restrictions, entered in the supervision plan. The annual supervision fees for the retail and wholesale sale of tobacco products, nicotine liquids and smokeless nicotine products, and nicotine medicinal products cover all planned inspections.

5 § Fees for other inspections under the Food Act

5.1 Separate fees are charged for the supervision of food premises exporting foodstuffs outside the European Union insofar as, at the requirement of the importing country, the export requires more extensive supervision than usual. The fee is determined on the basis of the time spent on the inspections.

5.2 Fees are charged for inspections that may be based on the supervision of measures referred to in sections 55-61 and 66 of the Food Act, according to the costs incurred.

5.3 In addition, a fee is charged for other supervision and related examinations as provided for in Articles 79-85 of the Control Regulation. This category also includes inspections of food premises carried out at the operator's request before the commencement of operations, and inspections outside the supervision plan carried out to ensure that deficiencies have been remedied. However, no fee is charged for inspections based on a suspicion report, unless the inspection is a follow-up inspection carried out due to non-compliance with regulations. In addition, a fee is charged for other measures resulting from non-compliance with regulations, such as the marking or destruction of food consignments following a prohibition imposed on the operator.

5.4 A fee corresponding to the costs incurred is charged for export certificates for foodstuffs.

5.5 A separate fee is charged for the supervision of intra-EU trade in foodstuffs subject to the salmonella special guarantees regulation.

6 § Fees for certain inspections and measurements under the Health Protection Act

6.1 A fee corresponding to the costs incurred is charged, in accordance with the appended fee table, for inspections, measurements, sampling, examinations and investigations carried out to investigate a health hazard or to ensure the elimination of a hazard pursuant to section 27 of the Health Protection Act.

6.2 The first inspection visit carried out to investigate a health hazard is free of charge.

7 § Sales permit fee and annual supervision fee under the Tobacco Act and the Medicines Act

7.1 The municipality charges an annual supervision fee per point of sale, in accordance with the fee schedule approved by the municipality, from any party holding a retail sales permit referred to in section 44 or granted under the former Tobacco Act, as well as from any party that has submitted a wholesale notification referred to in section 50 of this Act.

The supervision fee is EUR 500,00 per point of sale. However, if the operator has, pursuant to section 46(1)(2) or section 50(1), notified both the retail or wholesale sale of tobacco products and nicotine liquids, or has submitted a notification referred to in section 48 concerning the retail sale of nicotine liquids, the supervision fee is charged at no more than double the amount. The provisions above concerning nicotine liquids also apply to smokeless nicotine products.

8 § Determination of the supervision fee in exceptional cases and reduction of the fee

8.1 For an inspection included in the supervision plan, or for the processing of a notification or application, that requires an exceptionally large or small amount of work, the fee may be determined to be up to 50% higher or lower than the fee referred to in section 2.

8.2 Where the application of this fee schedule would, taking into account the nature and significance of the matter, lead to an outcome that is manifestly unreasonable, a lower fee than that provided for in the schedule may be charged, or the fee may be waived altogether, for exceptionally special reasons. However, the processing fee for a notification or application shall, as a rule, still be at least 50% of the fee that would otherwise be charged.

8.3 In exceptional cases, decisions on changes to a supervision fee or to a fee charged for the processing of a notification or application are made by the Environment and Permits Subcommittee of the Urban Environment Committee in matters within its competence, and by officials of Environmental Services in matters within their decision-making authority.

9 § Withdrawal and lapse of an application or notification

9.1 If the applicant withdraws their application or notification, or if the processing of the matter by the municipal authority lapses for another reason before a decision or certificate is issued, and the authority has taken substantial measures to process the application or notification, a fee is charged on the basis of the time used for the processing.

10 § Rejection of an application; application or notification left unexamined

10.1 A fee in accordance with this fee schedule is charged for an application that has been rejected, or where the activity referred to in a notification under the Health Protection Act is prohibited. If the grounds for the rejecting decision or prohibition are so clear that there has been no basis for more extensive processing of the matter, the fee is determined on the basis of the time used for the processing.

10.2 If an application is decided to be left unexamined, no fee is charged.

11 § Processing fee for a returned application

11.1 If, as a result of an appeal, a court refers the matter back for reconsideration, the amount previously charged for the supervisory authority's earlier decision in the same matter shall be deducted from the fee charged under this fee schedule.

11.2 If, as a result of an appeal, a court overturns the decision on the grounds that the applicant did not in fact require the approval decision applied for, any fee charged shall be refunded in full.

12 § Payment and recovery of fees

12.1 A fee in accordance with the supervision plan is invoiced for inspections carried out, with the exception of inspections of retail and wholesale outlets for products subject to the Tobacco Act, inspections of smoking bans and restrictions, and inspections of sales outlets for nicotine medicinal products under the Medicines Act.

12.2 The fee must be paid no later than the due date indicated on the invoice. The due date may be no earlier than two weeks after receipt of the service on which the determination of the fee is based.

12.3 If a fee imposed for a measure has not been paid by the due date, annual default interest is charged on the overdue amount in accordance with the interest rate referred to in section 4 of the Interest Act (633/1982). Instead of default interest, a late payment fee of EUR 5,00 is charged if the amount of default interest would be lower.

12.4 If a fee payable under this fee schedule has not been paid despite a reminder, it may be recovered through enforcement measures without a separate judgment or decision, in accordance with the Act on the Enforcement of Taxes and Charges (706/2007), as provided in section 74 of the Food Act (297/2021), section 50b of the Health Protection Act (763/1994), section 25b of the Tobacco Act (549/2016), and section 54d of the Medicines Act (395/1987).

12.5 The annual supervision fee for retail and wholesale outlets for tobacco products, nicotine liquids and smokeless nicotine products is invoiced on a calendar-year basis. In the first year, the date for determining the fee is the date on which the sales permit is granted, and in subsequent years 1 January. If the start date of operations stated in the application is after 1.12., no annual supervision fee is charged for the year in which the sales permit is granted. The charging of the annual supervision fee for retail and wholesale outlets for tobacco products, nicotine liquids and smokeless nicotine products ceases when the permit lapses. Fees are not refunded.

12.6 The annual supervision fee for a retail sales permit for nicotine medicinal products under the Medicines Act is invoiced on a calendar-year basis. In the first year, the date for determining the fee is the date on which the retail sales permit is granted, and in subsequent years 1 January. If the start date of operations stated in the application is after 1.12., no annual supervision fee is charged for the year in which the retail sales permit is granted. The charging of the annual supervision fee for a retail sales permit for nicotine medicinal products ceases when the permit lapses. Fees are not refunded.

13 § Entry into force

13.1 Fees are determined on the basis of the fee schedule in force on the date of the decision or the processing.

13.2 The amount of the annual supervision fee for retail and wholesale outlets for tobacco products, nicotine liquids and smokeless nicotine products, and for nicotine medicinal products, is determined on the basis of the fee schedule in force at the time of the fee review.

13.3 This fee schedule enters into force on 1.1.2026.

Appendix 1 Fee table

Food control

1.1 Processing of notifications for registered food and contact material activities

A fee of EUR 200,00 is charged for the processing of a notification concerning the commencement of operations, a material change in operations, or a change of operator.

A fee of EUR 100,00 is charged for the processing of a notification concerning the cessation of operations.

1.2 Document-based or remote inspection

For a document-based or remote inspection, a fee corresponding to the activity or matter concerned (Appendix 1, sections 1.3-1.16) is charged, from which 0.5 hours of travel time (EUR 38,00) is deducted.

1.9 Primary production sites

No fee is charged for an inspection carried out as part of the planned supervision of a primary production site.

A fee of EUR 195,00 is charged for a follow-up inspection of a primary production site.

1.10 Manufacture, further processing, import, distribution and marketing of food contact materials

1.11 Other food premises

For an inspection of food premises not listed in Appendix 1, a fee is charged on the basis of the time used (EUR 75,00 per hour) plus 0.5 hours of travel time (EUR 38,00).

1.12 Approved food premises and primary production sites for sprouts

Fees for the processing of applications and inspections of approved food premises are charged in accordance with Tables 6-10. If a follow-up inspection of an approved food premises is carried out in connection with a planned inspection, an additional fee of one hour (EUR 75,00) is added to the planned inspection fee.

1.13 Notification of termination of approved activity

A fee of EUR 100,00 is charged for the processing of a notification concerning the termination of approved activity.

1.14 Supervision of measures based on non-compliance with food regulations

For the supervision of measures based on non-compliance with food regulations, a fee is charged on the basis of the time used (EUR 75,00 per hour) plus 0.5 hours of travel time (EUR 38,00).

1.15 Inspections and other supervisory measures under section 5.3 of the fee schedule

For inspections and other supervisory measures referred to in section 5.3 of the fee schedule, a fee is charged on the basis of the time used (EUR 75,00 per hour) plus 0.5 hours of travel time (EUR 38,00).

1.16 Supervision of intra-EU trade in food of animal origin (salmonella special guarantees)

A fee of EUR 265,00 is charged for an inspection of intra-EU trade in foodstuffs subject to the salmonella special guarantees regulation, and a fee of EUR 195,00 for a follow-up inspection.

If an inspection of intra-EU trade in foodstuffs subject to the salmonella special guarantees regulation is carried out in connection with another planned inspection, an additional fee of EUR 125,00 is added to the planned inspection fee. No additional fee is charged for a follow-up inspection.

1.17 Sampling and examination fees

A fee corresponding to the costs incurred is charged for laboratory examinations.

1.18 Supervision of the export of foodstuffs

A fee of EUR 100,00 is charged for an export certificate.

A fee for the security paper base of the export certificate is charged in accordance with the Finnish Food Authority's fee schedule.

Separate fees are charged for the supervision of food premises exporting foodstuffs outside the European Union insofar as, at the requirement of the importing country, the export requires more extensive supervision than usual. The fee is charged on the basis of the time used for inspections (EUR 75,00 per hour) plus 0.5 hours of travel time (EUR 38,00).

The fee for processing a notification (commencement of operations, material change in operations, and change of operator) is EUR 200,00.

In situations requiring a greater than usual amount of work, the processing fee for a notification is charged on the basis of the time used (EUR 75,00 per hour).

The fee for an inspection carried out on the basis of a notification is determined according to the inspection fee for the type of object concerned.

For a document-based or remote inspection, a fee corresponding to the activity or matter concerned is charged, from which 0.5 hours of travel time (EUR 38,00) is deducted.

1.4 Sampling and examination fees

1.4.1 Sampling carried out by the authority

A fee of EUR 75,00 is charged for sampling carried out by the authority. Sampling may concern domestic water, bathing water (public pool facility, public beach, small public beach) or other supervision of orders issued on the basis of notifications/applications/inspections referred to in sections 1.1-1.3 of Appendix 2.

1.4.2 Sampling carried out by a party other than the authority

For sampling carried out by a party other than the authority, a fee corresponding to the costs incurred is charged.

1.4.3 Laboratory examinations

A fee corresponding to the costs incurred is charged for laboratory examinations.

1.5 Fees for measures carried out in a dwelling or other occupied premises

For an inspection carried out to investigate a health hazard or to ensure the elimination of a hazard pursuant to section 26 of the Health Protection Act, a fee is charged on the basis of the time used (EUR 75,00 per hour) plus 0.5 hours of travel time (EUR 38,00).

A fee of EUR 225,00 + VAT is charged for indoor air sampling.

A fee of EUR 300,00 + VAT is charged for noise measurement. For night-time measurements requiring a greater than usual amount of work, a fee of EUR 600,00 + VAT is charged.

For examinations and measurements carried out by an external expert or laboratory, and for laboratory analyses, a fee corresponding to the costs incurred is charged.
